The original list described it this way: “This is a journey of a Portuguese guy moving that decided that every photo should be used for free. Help yourselves and use them wherever you want (CC0).”

Best uses

Moveast is most relevant for historical reference only; use an active travel-photo provider for new work. Search by the subject, orientation, visual style, and required output size rather than choosing an image only because it is free.

Licensing and commercial-use considerations

The supplied URL did not yield a verifiable stock-photo site and was diverted through an advertising endpoint during review. No current catalog or license could be confirmed.

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- Make sure the resolution, crop, file format, and visual style fit the final placement.
