

StockSnap could not be fully verified as a currently reliable stock-photo resource; historically it focused on a searchable collection historically associated with free high-resolution photography. 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Best uses

StockSnap is most relevant for general stock-photo discovery when the site and asset license can be confirmed directly. Search by the subject, orientation, visual style, and required output size rather than choosing an image only because it is free.

Licensing and commercial-use considerations

Automated checks were blocked or diverted through an advertising endpoint, so its current catalog and license could not be independently confirmed in this review. Verify the destination and asset terms manually before use.

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- Make sure the resolution, crop, file format, and visual style fit the final placement.
